### **Learn about wildlife in Explorit ‘Twilight’ program**

Explorit Science Center’s free “Twilight Science” program will focus on the local wildlife that comes out of hiding as the sun sets. The program will be held at 6:30 p.m. Aug. 16 and repeating Aug. 23 at Explorit’s Mace Park Branch, 3141 Fifth St., Davis.

Visitors will take a guided nature walk through Mace Ranch Community Park with Explorit staff and volunteers in search of nocturnal wildlife. (The park is directly behind Explorit). A special guest only on Aug. 16 will be John McNerney, wildlife resource specialist for the City of Davis. He’ll lead the tours, during which you might expect to see burrowing owls, jackrabbits, cottontails, barn owls, bats, dragonflies, night herons and more.

Other activities planned at the informal, drop-in “Twilight Science” program will delve into animal classification, food webs and bird adaptations.
